



WEED & FEED APPLICATION GUIDELINES

In East Tennessee, apply weed and feed when weeds are actively growing and grass is not under drought stress. The ideal times are spring (mid-March to early June) and fall (early September to mid-October).

- **Apply when weeds are actively growing and soil temperatures are warm enough**—usually by mid-March—for cool-season grasses.
- **Do not apply during the hottest parts of the day, as high-salt fertilizers can burn your lawn.** Use a spreader, dividing the fertilizer into two equal, cross-applied, or “half-rate” applications to ensure even coverage.
- It is highly **recommended to get a soil test** to determine the exact nutrients needed for your lawn.

Determining Application Rate

To determine how much you need to apply, multiply the length of your lawn by its width. This equals your total square footage. Deduct all non-lawn areas (house, gardens, etc.). One bag covers up to 15,000 square feet. It is important to follow directions as indicated on this quality lawn care product, as over-application may cause injury to your lawn.

Spreader Notes

Spreader settings are approximate. Differences may occur due to the condition of the spreader, speed at which applied, and roughness of the area treated. Be sure to check the spreader before beginning, adjusting if necessary.
